School-based Traineeships

School-based traineeships are a great way for students to experiences what working in an early learning centre is like while they are still at school. The schoolbased traineeship period occurs one day per week over a two-year period while the student completes year 11 and 12. The student will complete an application and a few days unpaid work experience in one of our centres to get a feel for what working in early learning is like. This can occur in either term 4 of year 10 or during the summer school holiday period. The student then commences their traineeship at the start of year 11.

After years of supporting trainees, we recognise it can be challenging to balance work and study along with school commitments. We are committed to ensuring our school-based traineeship program compliments the students overall schooling program. We can provide flexibility to fit in with your school's timetable and learning priorities and will

keep in touch with you throughout the duration of the traineeship to ensure the best possible outcomes for the student.

Adult Traineeships

Adult traineeships are a great way to study a qualification while earning a wage. Trainees at Goodstart are offered employment for a twelve-month period while they complete their qualification. During this time, those engaged in the traineeship undertake paid work experience at a Goodstart centre for three to four days per week.

Vocational Training

We operate our own registered training organisation, The Goodstart Institute of Early Learning, offering the certificate III in early childhood education and care, the entry level qualification to work in early learning. We also have strong partnerships with many other external high-quality training providers, so the trainee can choose the provider that suits them best.

Safeguarding Children

At Goodstart we provide safe environments for children to grow and thrive. We ensure that all children can feel safe and be safe. This includes cultural safety. Goodstart Early Learning has been recognised as a Child Safe Organisation at the 2023 Queensland Child Protection Week Awards.

Traineeships are a great way to gain hands on paid work experiences while completing a certificate III in early childhood education and care. At Goodstart we offer both adult traineeships and school-based traineeships to complete a certificate III in early childhood education and care whilst providing a supportive centre environment where high quality on the job learning and experience will occur.

We work with our centre teams to ensure our centre environments are inclusive and culturally safe by:

- Recognising and celebrating our rich culture and connection to our history by weaving Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives through all that we do
- Promoting Aboriginal and Torres
 Strait Islander cultural awareness
- Recognising and celebrating days and events of significance for Goodstarters from all backgrounds - culturally and linguistically diverse Goodstarters and those from the LGBTIAQ+ community
- Delivering targeted programs supporting employment pathways and opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, Males wanting to work in early childhood and those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

- Full payment of the fees associated with the trainees vocational qualification training
- Placement within one of our centres for the work experience element of the traineeship
